New Stores Grand Opening

At time of going to press, the new *Hawkesbury Stores* has officially launched and the Grand Opening has taken place.

Crowds of people turned up to witness the proceedings and to raise a loud cheer, as Team GB Paralympic Footballer, James Blackwell, dropped in to declare the new *Hawkesbury Stores* officially

open, with the cutting of a ribbon. Villagers celebrated the new launch with free tasters of products from local suppliers, face painting, balloons, a prize draw and a children's colouring competition, whilst taking in the newly-branded community stores.

Volunteers have been working hard in recent weeks, painting, putting up new signs and carrying out a general refurbishment of the building in preparation for the launch.

The stores will now be staffed by a mixture of paid staff and volunteers, following the handover from Anne Weston and her team.

New products and services have already been brought in, with many locally-sourced.

James was invited to officially open the stores, before he sets off for Rio as part of the Paralympics GB football 7-a-side team. Hawkesbury will now be following James and the team's progress keenly over the coming weeks.

It's Showtime 2016!

This year's Show on Saturday 27th August, sees top entertainment on the day. *Meirion Owen and his Quack Pack* team will be topping the bill. Meirion is a farmer, born and bred, and is the third generation of his family to be involved in the art of training, competing and demonstrating with his border collies all over the country. The *Quack Pack* are his team of comical Indian Runner ducks and border collies. Together they provide entertaining, educational and interactive displays with audience participation.

Also appearing, both in the carnival and in the arena, are the *AcroGymnastics Group* who will be putting on a spectacular acrobatic and gymnastic display.

Back by popular request is also *Tricky Mickey's Punch & Judy Fun Show*, with entertainment for all the family.

Every stall pitch available around the arena has sold out, so you can also shop-'til-you-drop, with a wide variety of produce, crafts, charities and goods. Raffle tickets are already on sale and pre-paid admission tickets will be available up until the day before Show day.

So, get planning your entries. When you look through the schedule there really is something that everyone can enter. If you are unsure how to

present your entries, the Show committee will happily point you in the direction of some of the more experienced exhibitors who will be happy to help and advise. Let's make this a year of bumper entries!



Lower prices We're keeping a close eye on prices and we estimate that up to one third of items now cost less in Hawkesbury Stores. We lowered the price of 2L of milk by 16 pence, to £1.89.

Appearance of the Stores Phil Burrows has donated his time and skills and done an absolutely brilliant job on the shop colour scheme and logo, which were unveiled at the Grand Opening on 23 July. Thanks to a small army of hard-working and skilled volunteers we have our new colours on the shopfront and the wine/beer shelving, as well as hanging baskets adding a beautiful flourish!

The work doesn't stop there. We're applying for grant funding to help us transform the Stores' interior and will gradually be making more improvements in the meantime.

New products and services The shelves are filling up! We've brought in

delicious new breads, eco-friendly products, a wider choice of wines and should have sausages from France Lane Farm by the time you read this. We've had some super local produce donated – from cucumbers to herbs – and 'John's Fresh Grimsby Fish' has been coming each Wednesday morning (10.50-11.20am) to sell outside the Stores.

I can hardly believe the way that everything is growing. Our roses are usually over quite quickly but this year they seem to go on and on. And the fuchsias are so full of flowers that they are bending the stems - that blast of fire up the mites backsides from my blow torch last year really worked. I’ve never seen the Hebe’s so full of blossom and the honeysuckle scent is so sweet that it’s giving me a headache.

We’ve had a good crop of broad beans and the runner beans are (at time of writing) getting there.

At this point in the year the summer colour in the garden is just about starting to fade so there are one or two things we can do to keep the garden looking as attractive as possible, for as long as possible.

Dead-heading

The main purpose of most plants is to reproduce themselves and they do this by producing seed, which will form the next crop, after initially producing flowers. The aim should be to remove dying flower heads so that they do not get the chance to set seeds. If they do not set seeds, they have not done their job, and so will continue trying by producing flowers, for a longer period

Feeding

If a plant has been working to produce flowers all season, it needs to take nutrients out of the soil, which will then need replacing if the plant is to keep on working. The best results at this time of the year, will be achieved with a general purpose liquid fertilizer

August in the Garden

such as Phostrogen or Maxicrop applied to the instructions on the packet. While some companies have applicators which can be attached to a hose pipe, this can be very wasteful as they tend to cover most of the garden and not the specific area covered by a watering can. and why would you want to feed the weeds anyway?

Hawkesbury Show

Now that the show is almost upon, us we must bear in mind it is dependent upon entries in all classes for its continued success. For the potential first time exhibitor it's important to remember that everyone has to start somewhere.

My first entry, 29 years ago, was a set of asters displayed in a borrowed vase, which won a prize, and my wife was also a winner with a piece of knitting. From that point we were hooked and have always found that Show day is much more interesting if you can see your entry on the bench, and be involved fully.

,A few things to be aware of, if you're a virgin exhibitor..

1. Ensure that your entry conforms to the schedule exactly as to number of constituents and how it is to be presented.
2. Don't worry that the entry is not the biggest you have seen. What counts is the quality and the similarity in size and shape of the various parts of the entry.
3. Don't be in too much of a rush to get to the tent in the morning as you can see how the other entrants have laid out their items, if you wait until say 8.30 or 9pm.
4. When you see your entry after judging, note what has won in your class so you can see the standards needed to win. You never know it might be you!

Finally, if you peruse the schedule you'll find that in almost every garden in the village there's something growing which would make up an entry.

Sun, sea and sand can only be accompanied by burger and fries with all the trimmings washed down with a large non-diet coke.

Holidays are when dietary sense is consigned to the dustbin. Nutritious and healthy are words from a foreign language and salad and fresh veg are not to be uttered in mixed company.

But long before the burger hits the belly is the greasy spoon version of five star nosh; the full English breakfast. This wondrous dish of sausage, bacon, egg, mushrooms, tomatoes and hash browns can be upgraded to heavenly

status with the addition of beans and black pudding. It is the cause of much salivation, high cholesterol and the appearance of "muffin" tops around the waistband of shorts and button popping on shirts!

Double scoop ice creams topped with chocolate flake bars add to the misery that the digestive system has to cope with.

As my old mum used to say, "a little of what you fancy does you good," so who am I to argue with such great wisdom?

So get in there, add fried bread to your breakfast because salad and fresh veg is waiting readily in the wings to pounce on your paunchy bits when the holiday is over.

Hawkesbury and Inglestone Commons Officer

As I write this in the middle of July, the commons feel firmer under foot and are starting to dry out. We have just led a 'buttercup walk' and saw that the pools and ponds along the drive to Lower Woods have shrunk back, exposing mud which is excellent news for our esteemed 'mud plant' the adder's tongue spearwort. Kew and Bristol Zoo Gardens did an excellent job in growing on 500 healthy plants all of which are now planted around the recently cleared loop. Early indications are that they are doing

well, flowering and setting seed into said mud. After many years of few if any plants in their original pond, a bumper year with 20 plants appearing naturally, quite likely due to better access by cattle with the scrub edge now pushed back from the road. The Freshwater Habitats Trust have given additional funding for work clearing scrub from around some of the other ponds on the commons and I am starting on the required paperwork with Natural England and Forestry

Commission to get the appropriate permissions. This work will be particularly good for our other really special plant, tassel stonewort. Perhaps more of a connoisseurs plant, this algae lives in seasonal ponds, pools and ruts and is one of the very special nature features of the commons. It is hoped that this work will take place in the autumn.





Devolution

South Gloucestershire Council along with Bath & NE Somerset and Bristol City Council voted to go forward with the Devolution offer – £900m for the West of England area (without North Somerset) for 30 years; a new Metro-Mayor will be elected next May 2017. The new Mayor together with the leaders of the three authorities will form the Metro Combined Authority, and they will take responsibility for all infrastructure, highways, planning and housing growth. Planning - Policies, Sites and Places DPD

South Gloucestershire Council approved a revised Policies, Sites and Places (PSP) plan for public consultation.

The plan provides detailed planning policies that the council will use when making decisions on planning applications and also protects some of our much valued open spaces by designating those Local Green Spaces. There will be a formal consultation on the plan over the summer before it is submitted to the Secretary of State in October. A planning inspector will then consider it at an examination in February/March 2017, with the plan expected to be adopted in May next year.

Locally those places covered by the Local Green Space designation are:

- The Somerset Trust Monument Area
- The Recreation Field
- The Hawkesbury Upton Cricket and Tennis Club
- The Pound
- The Drovers Pool

Those areas put forward by the Parish Council but not agreed for Local Green Space Designation because of objections raised were:

- The Commons – objection received – and the area is over the 19 hectares recommended
- The Plain – this appears to be registered Highways

- The Allotments – objection received
- The Area opposite the Monument - There will be an opportunity to revisit this in the next round of consultation.

New Waste Collection & Buses

The Environment & Community Service Committee agreed the revised Waste Strategy, which includes proposals for smaller black bins, a nappy collection (thanks to those who responded to my plea for feedback) and changes to a weekly recycling collections.

They agreed on a new contract for Supported Bus services which include the 620 the 84 and 86. The 84 will run hourly clockwise round the Wotton/Wickwar/Yate/Sodbury/Horton/Hawkesbury/Wotton route, with the 85 running anti-clockwise round the cycle. The 86 service will run from Yate to Aspects Leisure Centre. New timetables have yet to be produced but will allow for school bus times.

The next Community Engagement Group – which replaces the Area Forum – will take place on Thursday 6th October at Cromhall Chapel, Cromhall.

At the July meeting, our last until September, Melanie Gibbs gave the Delegates Report on the NFWI AGM at Brighton. She said she'd really enjoyed the opportunity to go and found it a really inspiring occasion. The morning guest speaker was Rona Fairhead, Chairman of the BBC Trust who drew parallels between the BBC and the WI – both wanting to make a difference to the issues of importance to us, both very clearly independent organizations, both care about informing and educating, both concerned with inspirational women: both have sparked debate about women's issues, and both are trusted brands and a mark of quality. Melanie said the Resolutions: "Appropriate Care in Hospitals for People with Dementia", and "Avoid Food Waste, Address Food Poverty," were carried and will now receive the full support of the WI in their campaigns.

She said the digital age and digital printing

makes it possible for anyone now to be an author, and a bigger range of books provides more diversity for the reading public, however sometimes it makes for quantity not quality. However Debbie spoke up for self-publishing reminding us that the first Peter Rabbit book was self-published and Mark Twain also published himself too.

It was interesting to discover that The Yellow-lighted bookshops at Tetbury and Nailsworth are actually named after the book of that title by Lewis Buzbee. Debbie is also a supporter of Readathon a charity which brings the magic of books and stories to children in hospitals.

Afterwards Debbie was thanked for her interesting talk which demonstrated her passion for reading.

Meanwhile plans are going ahead for our show table entry for Hawkesbury Show, the theme of which is "A Paid Profession".
