

We are having a great term at preschool. We enjoyed a visit from Vicki and Emma, our local childminders, along with all their little ones!







Wrapping paper can be recycled in your green paper recycling bag, provided it does **not** contain glitter or is **not** made from non-paper material. Why not be even greener and use re-usable gift bags instead?

Christmas cards **without** glitter or plastic designs can be recycled in your normal kerbside cardboard collection. Why not cut up any with suitable designs to be used for next year's gift tags?

Christmas trees can be recycled in your green wheelie bin, provided the lid is closed. You may have to cut it up to make it fit. Also make sure all decorations have been removed.

TROWEL & ERROR

Meetings are held at 8pm on the 4th Monday of the month in the Methodist Hall in Back Street.

Disney Research have created 'Botanicus Interacticus', an interactive living plant exhibition which 'seamlessly merges computer generated images and sounds with living plants'. Apparently one can communicate with living and artificial plants by reaching to and touching them and 'observe the plants reply in the form of rich computer-generated imagery and sound'. It sounds a bit like 'Lucy in Sky with Diamonds' to me! You can watch the video on our website.

Our speaker for October was **David Cramp** who gave a talk on **Wildlife in the Garden**. He pointed out that most gardens are just too tidy to be much of a welcome to wildlife, indeed if we want to see wildlife in our gardens we would be better off letting the land go wild. However, many farmland birds are now coming into gardens because of modern farming methods such as the removal of hedgerows and since gardens cover more acreage than all the country's national parks put together there are many things that gardeners can do to help. Well-kept lawns in particular are not very wildlife friendly because the grass is too short and is treated with fertiliser, weedkiller and pesticides which kill off many of the natural food sources. Also clearing away dead or dying plants deprives birds of seeds and other small vertebrates of food and shelter. So let your garden and yourself go to pot and you'll soon be overrun with wild things, not all of which will be welcome I'm sure.

Mark Churchill is the designer of the skate park and is a professional skater. The skate park will include big and little ramps for all ages. Vicky Pember said "It's great to see it take shape."

Hawkesbury has been planning the skate park for one and a half years and had to raise £50,000. The skate park will give teenagers and younger children something else to do on weekends and there are many keen skaters in the village desperate to use it. It will be open on Saturday 10th November- but skaters have been asked to wait, ideally for a month, before it can be used!

Nigel said "Looking at it when it's done and everyone enjoying it is the biggest thrill."

Accounts were then presented and passed. With a favourable balance in the Members' Account it was voted to reduce the January subscription by £5. This will now be £28 for one year only.

With clothes rationing coming into force on the 1st June 1941 a utility scheme with the CC41 symbol was introduced. Several manufacturers were then ordered to look into making a range of clothing as simply and efficiently as possible with restrictions placed on pockets and buttons etc.

Should men still have turn-ups on trousers was one question that was looked into as any extra use of material was not approved. However it was decided that losing them could affect a man's moral. So they stayed!

With austerity measures in full force all manner of ways of making clothes was commandeered, and many a soldier returned from war to find his wardrobe had been cut up and used for the children's trousers and other necessary things!

Wool was in very short supply as it went into uniforms so old blankets were made into clothes too. There were no more silk for stockings either, as this went into parachutes and there was a ban on its use. However old parachutes made lovely weddings dresses if found!

Surprisingly hats were not rationed but classed as luxury items and heavily taxed.

We were shown an interesting range of clothing from the period, all very well made and meant to last, not like much of it today! And we all agreed that the classic, simple styled dresses, could be happily worn now.

So, with tea off the menu, the players feasted on a buffet that included a fine selection of well-travelled scotch eggs, kindly donated by Sean Hopson. Whilst the White Hunters savoured a particularly moist coffee cake, the Gents licked their lips in anticipation of victory.



Hopson was soon padding up with Sean Bath as the Gents prepared to knock off the runs under grey skies. We lost our first wicket with the score on 9, but George Setterfield confidently added 40 for the second wicket before being caught for 14. When Bath departed, after an entertaining 40 that contained six boundaries, the Gents were halfway home. A classic display of vintage Simmonds took the game away from the Hunters, delighting the crowd that had assembled (before he left to

feed his cat and watch Countryfile). With both feet firmly rooted to the ground, Simmonds produced a full array of cuts, drives, lunges, wafts, sweeps, swishes, swipes and swats. What's more, he occasionally managed to hit the ball as well, hitting seven splendid fours on his way to a majestic unbeaten 45. Together with Ben Foxwell, he put on 60 for the 4th wicket and victory was ours.

So it was that 2012 provided the Gents with their own statistical miracle: a first victory in 722 days.

Let's hope we don't have to wait so long for the next one!



A big thank you to all the committee and helpers for all their hard work this year, before and after the show. It just goes to show that if a village pulls together we can make this show fantastic every year!



News from the Rectory

Dear Friends,

Here is a letter from the Bishop of Tewkesbury:

From the Bishop of Tewkesbury, the Rt Revd John Went

When our children were very young and more recently with grandchildren the wrapping paper of Christmas presents sometimes appeared to be as exciting as whatever was wrapped up inside. One year the church used a slogan "Christmas unwrapped" to encourage people to engage with Christmas. In spite of hard financial times, for most Christmas will include good food, Christmas decorations, presents, time with family and friends. We as a family enjoy that side of Christmas as much as anyone. But there is more.

However exciting outer wrapping may be, once we take time to unwrap the gift inside, the gift at the heart of Christmas, there is something to be even more excited about. Christmas is the great unwrapping of God himself. God chooses to come and live as one of us, a fully human life. We witness the vulnerability of a new born baby born in unhygienic surroundings. Early on there is an attempt on his life by a power-crazy local ruler. Jesus and his parents become a refugee family in Egypt. Jesus is God's love-gift to the world. He entered a world with plenty of confusion, insecurity, pain, suffering, violence. He was known as the Prince of Peace. During his three years of ministry he constantly released God's love and healing power into broken, bruised, damaged lives. The world hasn't changed much. Jesus is still God's love-gift to a needy world, God's love-gift to individuals who long for security, a deeper meaning and purpose in life. We mustn't mistake the wrapping for the gift. The gift needs to be unwrapped.

I hope you may take time this Christmas to visit a church near you, to enjoy the carols, hear afresh the Christmas message, put yourself in the way of God's love unwrapped in the birth, life, death on a cross and resurrection of Jesus – there is no greater gift. A very happy Christmas to you all.

South Gloucestershire Councillor's Report

Is fast Broadband on its way?

South Gloucestershire Council, in partnership with Wiltshire Council, has announced that British Telecom has been chosen as the preferred bidder to provide superfast broadband to premises across the South Gloucestershire and Wiltshire area.

In June the partnership launched a procurement process inviting businesses in the Broadband Delivery UK (BDUK) national procurement framework, to bid for the contract and demonstrate why they would provide the best value for money and highest level of service.

The contract will be awarded once European State Aid approval is granted to the UK by the European Commission. The roll out of the broadband improvements will be completed in 2015.

The procurement programme is being led by Wiltshire Council with an investment of 15.5m with an additional 4.66m government funding. South Gloucestershire Council is investing £2.2m in the district's broadband provision, alongside £710,000 of government funding. The Council is aiming to award the contract in early December and will provide further details at that point.

I know many people have been asking for improved and reliable broadband speeds, we may soon find out what the predicted speeds will be for our area after the survey has been completed.

New Homes Bonus

As part of the Localism Act, monies will be available where new houses are built. South Gloucestershire Council has agreed that part of the monies should be allocated to the Area Forums, and at the next Frome Vale Area Forum (end of November) councillors will decide on how the £195,456 will be allocated. Most of the houses are being built in the Frampton Cotterell/Yate/Sodbury area. Councillors will decide the best way to allocate the money for the benefit of all residents.

Council Budget – more austerity.

South Gloucestershire Council is currently consulting on next year's budget. They are also asking for comments on the Council's priorities.

Government funding is falling drastically which means difficult decisions have to be made. £25 million savings have already been made from running costs over the past couple of years steered by consultation results. A large proportion of this has been made by improving administrative processes and professional support services. By 2014/15 the savings need to total £43 million a year based on the current national austerity measures. Plans are already in place to deliver a high proportion of the remaining amount. The council is now thinking about how it might approach further austerity measures after 2014/15.

Area Forums

The above matters are discussed at the Local Area Forums – Frome Vale Area Forum is our local forum. The Council is increasing the number of forums to five a year. Councillors representing the area will decide on the priorities for the area, in such areas as highway maintenance. They also allocate local grants.

An important part of the Forum is the Open Session, where members of the public are invited to have their say – usually quite a lively part of the meeting.. The next meeting is on the 29th November, 7.00 pm at Chipping Sodbury Town Hall.

Skate Park

After many years it is good to see the Skate/BMX facility taking shape.. This was an issue raised by young people in the Parish Plan consultation. Well done to the fundraisers and young people who worked hard to make this a reality. Well Done All and I was pleased to help with allocating some funds from the Housing Allocation Fund.

Streetcare

It is sometimes quicker to report any flytipping/potholes/streetlight issues online. But not everyone has access to the internet; please get in touch if you are having problems.




