

The Clevedon Motor Cars

Looking rather like a pair of bicycles with a sofa slung between them, the prototype car of The Clevedon Motors was designed and built by Richard Stephens in 1897/8.

Starting off his working life in a South Wales coal mine at the age of 7, Stephens grew up to become an entrepreneur, inventor and, inspired by the developments in the American automobile industry, the enthusiastic proprietor of a cycle and motor works in Clevedon, Somerset. The cars he built to his own design (including the engines) are generally regarded as the first all-British cars to go into series production.

With financial help from his friend Sir Edmund Elton of Clevedon Court, Stephens was able to develop automatic gas-lighters for the street lights of the day.

Balanced brake shoes which are the basis of the brake drums used today were also one of his many patents.

Bill Fairney's talk will give an insight into the life and achievements of this remarkable, yet comparatively unknown, man.



If you cannot bear to KILL them it has been proposed that you take them 100 metres away. To a nice comfortable habitat and supply them with copious quantities of forage I suppose. The mind boggles!

The same magazine casts a pall of gloom over the makers of those twee, expensive, save the planet, insect hotels and hedgyhoggy houseywousses etc. THEY ARE USELESS! Now there's a surprise!

Our November speaker, **Richard Cripps**, talked about **Pruning**. 

A WORD OF CAUTION...

At the end of November, unfortunately after the December issue went to print, we received an email from Rachael Claridge. Rachael recently moved into Back Street with her boyfriend, and wanted to let us know about an attempted theft on Back Street. This follows-on from a van break-in on Sandpits Lane.

Unfortunately on Friday night someone tried to steel one of the alloy wheels from my Nissan Navara pickup truck which was parked on back street just up from our cottage near the Post Office.



HAPPY NEW YEAR!

Early January, 12 days after Christmas, and we celebrate the feast of the Epiphany. Make the most of it – it won't be long until Lent!

In England it seems many people have forgotten the Epiphany, but throughout most of Europe it is still a major festival – at least as important as Christmas. And the festive season doesn't end there either, for there is still Candlemas at the beginning of February.

Perhaps it is inevitable that, in this northern hemisphere at least, we should lighten the darkest time of the year with feasts celebrating the coming of the Light, especially in what is for many people an especially dark and uncertain time. In such times it is easy to be seduced by the darkness, to give way to the gloom that is ever present even in the midst of the celebrations. Always, lurking behind the joy of Christmas, there is the reminder of the massacre of the Innocents – the grief of bereft parents, the pain and loss of refugees fleeing for their lives to a foreign country, the fear and dark-heartedness of corrupt rulers and the armies they command. Indeed it can sometimes seem as if the season of the Nativity reminds us that, as The Prayer Book says, "in the midst of life we are in death".

But I have always believed The Prayer Book has it the wrong way round. For what this season really teaches us is that among the darkest of shadows, even in the midst of death, we are in life. The feast of the Epiphany is a celebration of the sudden, clear and glorious manifestation of the light of God's oneness with us, *all* of us, not just a chosen few, wherever we are and whatever our circumstances. To celebrate Epiphany is to rejoice in the realization of God's presence with us *now* and an awareness of the unfathomable riches of Christ.

"Jesus Christ is the Light of the World, a Light no darkness can quench."

May the light, peace, joy and love of Christ bless and enfold you this Epiphanytide and throughout this new year.



They take the form of an orange, representing the world, God's creation, with a red ribbon round the middle, which shows the love and blood of Christ. 

District Councillor Report

As we get towards the end of the year – there appears to be no shortage of Council/Government reading matter being produced- just to keep us busy over Christmas!

The South Gloucestershire Core Strategy is a large tome (1000+ pages), and as this only arrived the other day, I am afraid I must own up to not having worked my way through it. This is the framework for future planning for our area and is the response to the consultation document in the summer. (Full document can be found on www.southglos.gov.uk)

Policy CS34: The Rural Areas recognises the value and distinctiveness of the villages, and how they differ across the area. The lack of affordable housing is regarded as a significant problem, with a decline in local services and facilities, combined with poor public transport. The aim of the policy is to set out an integrated approach to balancing the conservation and enhancement of the countryside with sustaining and promoting local rural communities and the rural economy.

The policy indicates the Council's intention to review the approach to the distribution of development in the rural areas in the future and to see the rural areas make a positive contribution to the generation of renewable energy and healthier lifestyles.

There are many references in this Strategy to the forthcoming **Localism Bill**. The publication was anticipated on the 9th December, but at the time of writing, is now anticipated before Christmas. The “**Community Right to Build**” initiative, which is part of the Localism Bill, could impact on the distribution of housing in the rural areas. It is anticipated that the Localism Bill will have a big impact on how local government works and I am sure we will hear more about this in the near future.

Many will have heard of “**The Big Society**”, which is part of the Localism Bill; people are still grappling with what this means for the voluntary and community sector. There are three core components to the Big Society and we can expect to learn more about them in the coming weeks.

- **Empowering Communities**

- Giving more power to councils and local people to take decisions and shape their area.
- Planning reform
- Right to buy and right to bid and run community assets

- **Opening up public Services**

- The Government's public service reforms will enable charities, private companies etc to compete to offer people high quality services.
- Promoting employee owned co-operatives, encouraging the creation of more social enterprises and innovative voluntary organisations.

Promoting Social Action

- Encouraging and enabling people from all walks of life to play a more active part in society and promoting volunteering and philanthropy.
- Reducing red tape
- The Big Society Bank; encouraging higher levels of social investment.

At a recent Big Society Debate with local M.P.s many of the community groups which are currently providing valuable services in the area voiced concern about the continuation of funding in uncertain times and the challenges this would give to providing these services.

Till Scam — Beware

CHECK YOUR RECEIPTS BEFORE LEAVING THE CHECK-OUT

I bought a bunch of stuff, over £150, & I glanced at my receipt as the cashier was handing me the bags. I saw a cash-back of £40. I told her I didn't request a cash back & asked her to delete it. She said I'd have to take the £40 because she couldn't delete it.

I told Her to call a supervisor. Supervisor came & said I'd have to take it.. I said NO! Taking the £40 would be a cash advance against my Credit card & I wasn't paying interest on a cash advance!!!! If they couldn't delete it then they would have to delete the whole order. So the supervisor had the cashier delete the whole order & re-scan everything! The second time I looked at the electronic pad before I signed & a cash-back of £20 popped up. At that point I told the cashier & she deleted it. The total came out right. The cashier agreed that the Electronic Pad must be defective.

Obviously the cashier knew the electronic pad was defective because she NEVER offered me the £40 at the beginning. Can you imagine how many people went through before me & at the end of her shift how much money she may have pocketed?

Just to alert everyone. My co worker went to Milford , Sainsburys last week. She had her items rung up by the cashier. The cashier hurried her along and didn't give her a receipt. She asked the cashier for a receipt and the cashier was annoyed and gave it to her. My co worker didn't look at her receipt until later that night. The receipt showed that she asked for £20 cash back. SHE DID NOT ASK FOR CASH BACK!

My co-worker called Sainsburys who investigated but could not see the cashier pocket the money. She then called her niece who works for the bank and her niece told her this. This is a new scam going on. The cashier will key in that you asked for cash back and then hand it to her friend who is the next person in the queue.

Please, please, please check your receipts right away when using credit or debit cards!

This is NOT limited to Sainsburys; they are one of the largest retailers so they have the most incidents. I am adding to this. My husband and I were in Sainsburys and paying with credit card when my husband went to sign the credit card signer he just happen to notice there was a £20 cash back added. He told the cashier that he did not ask nor want cash back and she said this machine has been messing up and she cancelled it. We really didn't think anything of it until we were sent this.


