

Garden Enemies

Growing vegetables is not just about sticking stuff in the ground and going out to pick your fill a few weeks later. We have to face competition from nature in the form of bugs and diseases, if we are to get benefit from our efforts. The following problems are common around the village, and hopefully the methods of prevention and treatment will be of some use.

Carrot Fly

A tiny fly whose larvae tunnel into carrots and render them useless, can be frustrated in a number of ways. They don't actually fly, they hop and if carrots are planted in containers taller than 18 inches they will be thwarted. A fine-meshed fleece will also act as a barrier, in a normal row.

Blackfly in broad beans



If broad beans are planted over winter they will often be early enough to miss the first infestation of blackfly but failing this, when the first beans have formed, removal of the tops of the plants should limit the damage as the fly only seems to infest this area'

Potato blight

Shows up as a spotting of the leaves and a softening of the stems which become slimy and smell awful as do the infected potatoes. This disease, for some reason, has been affecting the area earlier in the recent past and whereas the advice has been to spray with a fungicide from mid-July, I have found that this has been too late. I would therefore advise that plants should be sprayed with Dithane 945 in mid-June and repeated at least 3 times at 2 week intervals.

Affected plants should not be composted, but either binned or burned.

Cabbage Root fly

The eggs of this fly are laid on the surface of the soil near newly planted cabbages and other brassicas. On hatching, they burrow down to the roots of the young plants and make their homes there. As they eat the roots the plant will topple and die, but this will often take just long enough to make it too late to replant. If a collar about 20 cm. wide is placed around the young cabbage the eggs are laid on this and will just shrivel up. This method is a bit of a fiddle but if executed properly it is foolproof. The collars can be bought at most garden centres or easily cut out of builders' damp course

Onion Diseases

In the last few years some people around the area have had fungal problems with onions and other alliums. The most common of these has been a disease called downey mildew. It manifests as mould on the neck of the onion and will quickly spread through a crop and ruin it if not treated immediately. I have had some success in its treatment with Dithane 945 and I actually pre-empt the problem by spraying from mid-June. The other more serious problem is White rot, which is a white fungus appearing around the roots of the onion and causing an early distortion of the onion. Any crop affected, should be destroyed and the ground where the crop was grown should not be used for onions for ten years.



Blossom End rot

This shows as a dark hard patch on the bottom of the tomato which ruins the fruit. It is due to a calcium deficiency in the plant caused by watering at irregular intervals. It can be sorted out with an addition of calcium (available in various forms at garden centres) and a return to regular watering.

Aphids in the Greenhouse

White and greenfly can be a nuisance in the greenhouse, but can be deterred simply by having a few pots of marigolds placed around the plants with some near the door. The flies simply don't like the smell. How organic is that?



I hope that these tips have addressed some of the common problems in the garden. I realise that there are many others but the ones I have listed seem to some of the most common



The low voltage incident in the village on the 11th & 12th January this year

The aim of this article is to give feedback on the incident and on the out come of discussions with the network company. This article only covers what happened in the village, but the incident affected an area extending well beyond Hawkesbury Upton. The responsibility for maintaining and distributing the electricity supply is with the network distribution companies, not the electricity generating companies. While you can change your electricity supplier you can't change your network distributor. At the time of the incident our network distribution company was Central Networks, on the 1st April they were taken over by Western Power Distribution (WPD).

The incident: Early in the evening of the 11th January there was a brief loss of the electricity supply, the supply was restored but at a low voltage. The correct supply voltage was not restored until the following afternoon – hence the village experienced a very low voltage supply for about 20 hours.

Everyone would have been aware that the voltage was low as for example, lights were very dim and some equipment wouldn't work. The domestic supply voltage should be 230V, no lower than 207 volts and no higher than 244 volts. Several villagers measured the voltage and found that it varied between about 173 and 200 volts over the period. This variation is well below the statutory lower limit, below the design voltage of most domestic equipment and hence can cause damage.

Response of Central Networks during the incident: several people phoned Central Networks to report the fault. The telephone response was a recorded message stating that there was a known fault, that it was being dealt with and that the supply would be restored as soon as possible. Some people spoke to an operator to report the low voltage and were told to turn off equipment which had a motor. Central Networks made no attempt to spread this information to other consumers affected by the incident or to be specific as to which appliances should be turned off.

Immediate effects of the incident and Central Network's response

During the incident many appliances failed to operate or didn't work properly. Of particular concern was the erratic behaviour of emergency call systems used by vulnerable people. You will recall that Bill Fairney asked villagers to contact him if they had experienced problems or equipment failures during and after the incident. The data collected by Bill showed a range of appliance failures that were either dealt with by consumers, by a service call or by replacing the equipment.

The consequence of the low voltage to consumers was that on a cold winter's night many people lost their central heating; following boiler failure or lockout. We are also aware of the failure of domestic appliances including refrigerators, freezers, washing machines, microwaves, a hairdryer etc. In total we are aware of 35 incidents of equipment failure; no doubt this is a significant under estimate of the total number of people who suffered problems and inconvenience. Our feedback indicated that Central Networks responded positively to reported appliance failures, calls were dealt with efficiently and without undue bureaucracy; cheques to cover the cost of replacing appliances were issued quickly.

Investigations after the incident

Following the incident we pursued the matter further both by letter and a meeting with Central Networks to find out what happened and to ensure that steps were being taken to ensure that it doesn't happen again. As a result, the now, Western Power Distribution representatives attended the Open Parish Council Meeting on the 4th April, to reassure residents and answer questions relating to the incident.

Before the Parish Council Annual Assembly meeting we found the following:

During the period of this incident the village supply was restored by rerouting our supply around a number of faults. Our supply was restored by rerouting via a long line fed from the from the Gloucester area, the consequence was that our supply voltage fell as energy was taken by consumers nearer to Gloucester. Hence our supply voltage fell at times of peak demand and rose when the demand dropped.

Network distribution companies only routinely measure the voltage at the network feed end; they do not routinely monitor the voltage elsewhere on the network. When a consumer reports a low supply voltage, the incident is logged and related to a reported fault. In this case the low voltage incident was related to a fault near Gloucester and engineers were sent out to measure the voltage in this area, not necessarily in the area shown by the callers post code. Consequently, the low level of our supply was not known to Central Networks despite the reports!

At the Annual Assembly Meeting

- WPD apologised for the incident and said that it had arisen following several events and multiple faults on the supply network. They conceded that they had made errors in handling the incident and that calls complaining of a low voltage supply had been recorded but were not handled well.

The low voltage incident (continued)

- WPD will make changes to their IT as well as their procedures. In particular consumer's calls complaining of low voltage should be treated with more urgency and dealt with at a more senior level. Further the geographic location of callers reporting a low voltage supply should be used to show where supply voltage measurements should be made. Additional fixed voltage measurement was unlikely to prove to be cost effective.

- WPD said that they have a 5 year plan which includes network reinforcement; part of this is to provide an alternative feed for this area. The work to implement alternative feeds is planned to be undertaken later this year. We were assured that the takeover of Central Networks by Western Power Distribution should not alter the plan as formal agreement lies with Ofgem.

- WPD accepted that they had provided a voltage that was well outside of specification for about 20 hours. Consumers had no reason to believe that the supply could damage equipment; however, experience has shown that this trust was misplaced. We are looking to WPD to show that they have taken actions to ensure that there will be no repeat of the incident before they can regain our trust.

- WPD maintains a register of vulnerable customers who are contacted in the event of a supply problem to let them know that there is a fault and when it is expected to be cleared. A 'vulnerable customer' pack is available and a limited number will be available from the Parish Council (contact Andrew Musty) from 23rd May.

- WPD will report back to the Parish Council showing progress in improving their processes, IT and strengthening the distribution network as it applies to the village.



The End of an Era?

Currently, as far as we are aware, there are no Hawkesbury Youth football teams. The past was a different story and what follows below should be an inspiration for Hawkesbury's parents and youngsters (and maybe even make a Hollywood blockbuster in years to come..!)

This is the story of a youth team starting as under 7's and 11 seasons later finishing as U18 League Champions.

The origins of football in Hawkesbury are lost in the mists of time (well, precede global warming, at least). It is believed that many Hawkesbury sporting elders (often to be found playing Veterans' cricket, or propping up the bar in our fine public houses) displayed a nifty turn of speed on days of old(e). We can only tell of modern times and since our own children were involved. As far as we can recall that footballing 'legend', John Stanbridge, having developed his own children's skills in the back garden with a 6 x 10 sheet of plyboard (best substitute for a garage wall or broken house windows that we know) took them out onto the Rec for a kick around. Being an organised kind of chap, he soon established a team which included his son, Jack, Joe Doughty, Dan Blackwell, Tom Setterfield, Clem Studholme, Mark Maynard, Sam Blakeney and Toby Phillips (between the posts), to name but a few, and put them into a local league. History doesn't record the outcome (we hope), save to say that Toby won the S Glos 'Opposition Manager's Boy of the Year' (saving as many as passed him, but finding the Hawkesbury goal so peppered every game that the opposition manager invariably felt sorry for him!).

Over time other teams followed on (as the younger Stanbridges, Ollie, Emma and Beth came onstream), with John & Jane organising all the fixtures, managers and registrations. The game in Hawkesbury snowballed until, in its heyday, the annual awards, lasting several hours and involving dozens of awards, rivalled 'The Oscars' for speculation, gossip and (attempted) dodgy deals! The speeches were marvels of wit and repartee. Not infrequently there were tears – and even the children could get a little sad too. Occasionally, for a treat, we all embarked on coaches for an away training session, followed by a Premiership match at Aston Villa, courtesy of Bill Cullen (their biggest fan – in more senses than one!).

Hawkesbury was abuzz with football chat, where dozens of little boys – and a few little girls – had a lovely time chasing a ball around a field ('passing the ball' would be a thing for the future..)

So there we have set the scene.

This story focuses on a group of youngsters who started playing football together in the U7 team and included the following future stars:- Max Denniff, Adam Phillips, Jamie Evans, Charlie Moreton, Matt Vaughan, George Bailey, James Crighton, Sam Nichols, and Tim Journeaux. In 2003/4 season the team moved to Hillesley with Gavin Bailey as Manager and the Secretary's role being so efficiently undertaken by Alwyn Vaughan.

Unlike their predecessors, this team did not have anyone allocated as the full time goalie, and so before the game, if there was no volunteer, lots would be drawn and the hapless youngster would be forced into goal. Tears often ensued when the ball went into the back of the net.

Now that we were playing 11 a side, additional players joined the squad including Hannen Ashlee, Alex Risdale, Will Massey, Jim Davis, Tom Proudley and George Whatley.

The offside rule was introduced into the game but most of this early team failed to grasp its significance. So consequently it was ignored! As the team moved on to gain more success, the squad was increased to its present levels.

And so, in 2009, the team graduated to Under 18 level. Under the management of newly-appointed Steve Blakeney, they, with most players young in the age group, had a fairly successful season, finishing fifth.

Hawkesbury Volunteer Transport Group

HVT continues to provide a very successful service taking local residents to a variety of medical appointments at destinations that range from Cheltenham to Bath, and from Bristol to Cirencester plus many places in between.

Our passenger list has expanded, so it is little wonder that the number of miles driven each month has also increased. March and April this year were exceptional months, and resulted in abnormally high mileage, achieving 985 and 1062 miles respectively. This is almost double our usual performance.

Overall since our first journey in August 2007, the volunteer drivers have carried out 965 journeys and travelled 22917 miles. This also means that our Co-ordinators have made between three and four thousand telephone calls.

HVT is still urgently looking to increase the number of drivers that are available, so if you are willing to give a little of your time and are prepared to use your own car or drive the community vehicle (a red Citroen Bellingo) to help maintain the current service, please contact Alan Shewry.

The Co-ordinators job provides the most important link between passenger and driver. The task involves checking the answer phone one or two times each day, (provided by HVT) maintaining a diary, and booking drivers to take passengers to their appointments.

Currently we have three volunteers who carry out these duties, Sandra, Vicki and Carol, two of whom are working ladies. Between them they share the task, one week on and two weeks off.

To maintain our present standard, and to increase our flexibility, especially during holiday periods, an additional one or two volunteers would be of great value.

So, if you have some spare time, and are willing to use it for the benefit of the community, how about joining HVT and becoming a Co-ordinator or a Driver.

Are you interested in helping?

"GIFT A WINDOW". The Friends of St Mary's window was re-instated last week after renovation, the masonry work to the three South aisle windows will be completed at the end of May. The small windows in the South Porch Parvis room have been removed and will be replaced with leaded lights and the bars from the small window in the downstairs South Porch has also been removed, the masonry around these three windows was in a bad state of repair. Once the weather improves we will continue with the north clerestory windows, at which time the masonry work for the north windows will be addressed this may be late July. The design for the St Wulfstan stained glass roundels has been approved and we have received a faculty (which is like planning permission) if everything goes well we hope to have this installed in July. A further thought is to divide some of the larger windows, for example the side aisle windows which have three sections, each section for the sum of £895.00. also a North Clerestory window which also has three sections, for the sum of £531.00.



We still have a number of windows which have not yet been gifted, however I have to say that the response to this project has been overwhelming, and I offer our very grateful thanks for the support we have received to date.





Bogus charity collecting clothes in South Glos warns Trading Standards

A flyer is being distributed in the South Gloucestershire area seeking to collect clothes on behalf of a **bogus charity** called 'Breaking the Waves'.

Checks have found that the website on the flyer does not connect, the phone number is no longer valid and the company BTW Ltd does not exist. In addition the charity number, 1133899, listed on the flyer has been withdrawn. South Gloucestershire Council's trading standards officers and neighbourhood police are **warning people in the area to be wary of door-to-door leaflets asking for unwanted clothing.**

Trading Standards said: "Clothing collections are regularly conducted throughout the area and, although some are genuinely for charitable purposes, we have concerns that others are just done for commercial gain and that the public are being misled by false claims about the use to which their donations are put and the use of bogus company details. The only way to guarantee that donations benefit good causes is to deal only with charities you know are genuine, or take unwanted items direct to a charity shop. At the moment textile prices are high and consumers need to ensure that their valuable donations reach the organisations they wish to give to".

As such its very easy to forget to lock things away and unfortunately these thieves know that and are opportunistic. They will be out and about most evenings/nights and they are getting sneakier going into areas that we least expect. They wont visit us every night, every week or even every month just when we least expect it, so please lock away your valuables, put them out of sight and if appropriate mark them in some way. Concealed postcoding is very popular and if the goods are found the Police will look for that.

TRADING STANDARDS — ATTENTION! The Tricks Rogues Play

South Gloucestershire Trading Standards would like to remind residents to **be extra vigilant when dealing with unsolicited visits from traders and the deals they offer.**

A **new trick** being used by rogue traders is to **back date the contract paperwork so it looks like the consumer's cooling off period has expired.** This then prevents consumers from cancelling the contract, committing them to the work and the cost.

Always check the date on the contract before signing anything and, if it has been back dated, consider whether you really want to go ahead with work by a rogue trader who has just tried to deny you your legal right to a 7 day cooling off period.

To help avoid becoming the victim of a rogue trader, here are some **simple tips** to remember –

- ◆ Be wary of traders who cold call and the deals they offer you – it is unusual for genuine tradesmen to need to cold call to drum up work!
- ◆ If they claim work needs doing, get a second or even third opinion from other professional tradesman.
- ◆ Obtain a number of quotes, in writing and detailing what work will be done.
- ◆ If you agree to work following an unsolicited visit, you are afforded cancellation rights by law, and these should be given to you in writing.
- ◆ Ensure you have the correct company name and/or owners name and the full postal address – this will not guarantee the work is done satisfactorily but may enable you to take further action if things go wrong.
- ◆ If the goods / services cost £100 or more, try and pay some or all of it on a credit card as this may afford you additional protection.


