



A note to Hawkesbury Show virgins

There is still time for planting, in many of the horticultural classes of the show. For those who visit the show and appreciate the attractions of the tent, the enjoyment can be much enhanced by actually having an entry on the bench and taking part.



From the beginning of May, there are still 17 weeks of growing time to get a couple of entries ready. With the possible exception of onions, potatoes, and one or two others in the vegetable classes, most items will grow to maturity in the time available, as is the case with almost everything in the flower classes. Whilst there are special skills involved to reach regional or national standards, basic plant care and adherence to the instructions on a plant label or seed packet will be enough to bring a successful result on Show day.



One of the reasons quoted by some non-participants is lack of space! Think then, on the following. One square metre is sufficient space to grow sufficient items to form an entry in the following classes.

french beans, kidney beans, broad beans
 round beetroot, turnips, short carrots
 lettuce, cherry tomatoes
 zinnias, asters, French marigolds
 gladioli, antirrhinums, pansies
 sweet peas





“Boxwell, where the church and houses are, lies at the top of a little glyn or dale, about half a mile from the turnpike road from Gloucester to Bath; and seen from several points of view, appears extremely rural and picturesque. It is watered by a rill which rises in the parish, and runs through it; and is covered, at an agreeable distance, by a hanging wood on one side of it; a situation particularly eligible in the summer season, and the surrounding hills secure it from the bleak and cold winds of the winter”

A New History of Gloucestershire, Samuel Rudder, 1779

Park at the top of the Boxwell Road (turn off the A46) on the left hand side just past the cottages which are on the right.



On the Run

Sending a text on my mobile as I jogged past Hawkesbury Monument the other day, it occurred to me that I was only a stone's throw from writing my blog on the run. So many of my friends update their Facebook status from iPhones and Blackberries that I'd been thinking about investing in a smart phone myself, so that I could post to my online blog while away on holiday.

It's not the first time I've hankered after equipment to help me write while travelling. Years ago, long before the rise of the internet or the miniaturisation of the mobile phone, there was a clever little gadget on the market. A bit like a miniature version of the shorthand machines used by courtroom stenographers, it was like a tiny typewriter but with just four keys, one for each finger of one hand. You tapped the keys in a different combination for each letter of the alphabet. Even in a shaky commuter train, you'd be able to write legibly, because when you got home, the machine would spool out what you'd typed in normal letters. One of these devices would have made my daily commute across London suburbia more productive, but my salary as a lowly editorial assistant wouldn't stretch to one.

Another reason I wanted it is that I'd never learned shorthand. Several times in my teens I had bought teach-yourself books, but even with daily practice, I knew that it would take a long time to master. With the short-termism of the typical teenager, I couldn't make the commitment. Every year or two after, I would think to myself "If only I'd stuck at it, my shorthand would be fluent by now".

So if I do write my column on the run, I'll have to use an even more old-fashioned device to record it – my brain. I just wish my head had a USB port so that I could back it up with a memory stick.







The design for the St Wulfstan stained glass roundels has now been approved by the Diocesan Advisory Council together with an application for a faculty which has been on display in the Church Porch and inside the Church, this has now been returned and if agreed the Faculty will be sent to us, hopefully quite quickly, at this time we can then commission the roundels and make arrangements for their installation.

In the financial total already received we have donations towards a 'Village or Community window' a Friends of St Mary's Window also St Wulfstan Window. The name of everyone who has contributed will be entered in the book which will be kept in the Church. As suggested 'THE GIFT OF A WINDOW' can be a group of people, an association, a family, a business, or in memory of a loved one, or for a special birthday or wedding anniversary. A further thought is to divide some of the larger windows, for example the side aisle windows which have three sections, each section for the sum of £895.00. and a North Clerestory window for the sum of £531.00

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting in St Mary's Church on 10 April saw the end of an era. We said farewell to Mary Beresford as churchwarden for the last 12 years, and welcomed Mary Davies **for one year only** in her place. We owe Mary Beresford a tremendous debt of gratitude for all she has done during her time in office. She has worked endlessly and tirelessly for St Mary's, getting up early in the morning to go down to the church to meet builders and architects and other experts, checking the building in bad weather, arriving early always to see that everything was in place and as it should be. In brief, she almost lived there! She has resigned as churchwarden because she is in training to become a Reader, and can no longer devote the time and energy to all she has done in the past, but we shall still benefit from her generous care and thoughtfulness for us as individuals. Thank you, Mary, for all that you have done.

We are also extremely grateful to Mary Davies for agreeing to be churchwarden again. She took this on with the strict understanding that it is to be for one year only, so it is not too early to be searching our minds for someone to take over next year. The duties will be very different from those carried out by Mary Beresford, many have been handed over to other people, and she has agreed to see out the major windows project. No further major works are envisaged for a few years to come, save unforeseen disaster.

There are no big events in the church calendar during May, but please note that there are **five** Sundays in the month. As agreed with the other parishes in our small group, services on the fifth Sunday will rotate, and so the service on **29 May will be at Boxwell at 10 am.**

CHURCHWARDENS REPORT — 10TH APRIL, 2011

This will be my last report, I have been Churchwarden for 12 years and I can honestly say that it has been a privilege to have served God , St Mary's Church and the village in this way, all three are all very close to my heart.

We have seen many changes, a few difficulties, but together we have overcome, and we are at present in a time of stability. Revd. Christopher Mulholland and Revd. Alveen heading our Clergy, the P.C.C., the Local Ministry Team and our Lay Team, all of whom look after our spiritual needs and the running of the Church. We are settled in our Benefice with the assurance from the Deanery that Hawkesbury will not, in the conceivable future be transferred, so the major problems have been solved, and we should be in a period when consideration and every effort should be given to the growth of our congregation. This will require outreach and encouragement, the need for people to feel that they would like to be part of their Church , to return to Church or attend on a more regular basis.

Services. We maintain the style of services, Morning as more modern with the young in mind, the PCC and Lay team will be looking at the service sheets, to ring some changes. Evening using the Book of Common Prayer, in the last few weeks we have tidied up the two evening services, one now Evensong and the other Holy Communion, this seems to have been accepted. These together with a number of additional services, form our pattern of worship.

Many of these services are enhanced by the Choir led by Pauline Setterfield, rehearsals continue on Thursday evenings and we are extremely grateful for their support, we include here Jon Crow, Pauline Setterfield and Ralph Pidsley for playing the organ.

It has been mentioned that a junior choir perhaps linked with the school would be a way of encouraging more young people at our morning services, further discussion I hope will take place.

As last year, we are still experiencing difficulties with Sunday School , now known as Sunday Club, discussion are ongoing with the possibility of a village letter drop advising families of the format of these sessions.

'The Works' I am extremely sorry to say has been stopped at this time, various reasons have caused this, The Guides meeting every Thursday has meant a drop in girls attending, we have been down to 4/5 children attending. Secondly, our main craft worker has had health problems, and my attendance has been affected by my Readers Course lessons which take place on Thursday evenings. We are considering small workshops either at after school time or perhaps weekends, this is being discussed.

Our faithful readers and sidesmen still continue to assist in services , but we are finding the need for there to be more of each , summer times become a problem when sporting activities run on into the evening.

More people to help clean the Church and arrange flowers are needed, even the one off couple of hours, giving a good sweep round the corners and an extra dust would be so helpful, it is a large building, and with the additional mess caused by the removal for restore of the windows, has meant the dust settles for quite a long time, even though the builders are very good at clearing up.

I feel at this point I must mention the overwhelming generosity of the Village and members of the Friends of St Mary's, donations are still being received and we have over £67,000 , with 19 windows restored, the program is continuing with a further 5 windows being worked on at the end of the month.

The design of 3 stained glass roundels to commemorate St Wulfstan have been accepted by the DAC and a faculty notice is on display in the Church , I have put a copy of the design on the table for anyone who has not yet seen this. The end of the project is in view and if agreed I will continue to oversee this work.

Other donations have been received which have allowed for the front doors of the north porch to be re-glazed and a hand carved alms box to be made. We are grateful to the family of the late Jim Morgan for this work.

Advent and Lent Lunches have continued with a good number of people attending, once again the three churches working together. Help is still received from people making soup, providing rolls, butter and fruit. The help by the Yoga Group setting up the tables is of great help. This is a truly Christian way of sharing a meal, in order to help various charities. I recognize at this time the endless work of Genevieve Thomas, her enthusiasm for charity fundraising was second to none, Both Genevieve & Bruce will be greatly missed by our Church and also the village, Genevieve's

Visits from Hawkesbury School children has continued with a Christmas production in the Church, it is so encouraging to see the children, rehearsing, acting & singing using the space of this beautiful building, bringing it to life and worshipping.

Friends of St Mary's remarkable in their support, Yew cutting, church cleaning and fundraising, through them we have received a number of substantial donations towards the windows, these we may not have received if this enthusiastic group were not in place, As always our continuing gratitude.

Our PCC members continue to work hard and guide the running of St Mary's Church, they are a small group who need help, I hope some of our church members will volunteer to assist them with this necessary roll. A special thank you to Michael Bendry our treasurer who has felt the additional weight of the money coming in as donations towards the Window project, naturally this has caused him a considerable amount of extra time. Thank you also to Betty Salthouse our Secretary for all the time she gives and to Sharon Gray our Deanery Representative and to Barbara Stephens for overseeing the Gift Aid, this also has been a greater task because of the Gift a Window project.

Linda Fairney is a strong reliable dedicated Warden and I know with the assistance of Mary Davies, who is standing for one year only, together they will continue to maintain the running of St Mary's admirably. I have very much enjoyed my time working with Linda, we have worked together very well, our enthusiasm rubbing off from one to another, changing a light bulb on top of a ladder, brushing away cobwebs on the top of high scaffolding, or assisting with due reverence at a funeral, all of this she does more than willingly, we are extremely fortunate that she is standing again for another year. I have been voted onto the P.C.C tonight to help with continuity.



The Commons

After a great deal of work and effort by many people, it is a pleasure to announce that South Gloucestershire Council has signed the Higher Level stewardship agreement with Natural England. There was a delay because of the Comprehensive Spending Review; however the Stewardship Agreement is dated from the 1st April 2011.

The agreement contains many prescriptions which will have to be met to receive the funding of £20,000+ per year for 5 years. The immediate priority is the grazing of the Commons and a meeting has been held with those who turn out cattle to get the maximum benefit this season. **However it is important, and part of the Agreement that the Commons grass is not cut or mowed by individuals, to ensure there is full grazing.**

There will be an Open meeting in the summer to discuss the scrub clearance and further management of the Commons.

The Month of May

What a month. So much seems to happen in it. My birthday is in it. All football competitions come to a head during it. Also, Foster Care Fortnight falls in it, a time when being a foster carer and looking after children in care is highlighted more than it is during the rest of the year, although it is still, obviously, a vital issue all year round.

Have you ever thought about foster caring at all ? Or if it is something you are not able to consider yourself, do you know someone else who might be thinking about it ?

You may have read me asking these questions before but the need for more foster carers is always there. We will always need more because children are always coming into care and people who already care for us will, at some time, stop doing it, for whatever reason(s) they may have. We accept that and vow to keep trying to fill the pool with new people. It is my job to try and reach out to these new people.

The public perception of foster caring is that it is an onerous task, an unnecessary life-changing event and definitely something that only other people should get involved with. So, how can I address all these points and present reasons why people should seriously think about foster caring and, once completely convinced, then make that first step by contacting me ? I shall try to do this below:

Foster caring will always be regarded as an onerous task to those outside the process because it involves taking in a child or young person who needs care. It is, by its very nature, something extra that needs to be done. These children need to be looked after by people who can offer them a nurturing, positive environment and it is carers who can offer this that we are looking for.

Fostering a child or young person will change your life, as will introducing anyone - or anything different - into your lifestyle and household. This is why any carers, when being assessed, are as prepared as possible for the time when a child arrives.

Yes, other people do get involved in foster caring and they are supported every step of the way by this authority. As the ultimate welfare of the children is our responsibility it is in our best interest that the foster carers we attract, assess, approve and, very importantly, retain are people we can trust, call upon and know will provide the best care for the children. In exchange for this we offer generous fees and allowances, structured training, interaction with existing foster carers and continuous, ongoing support.

I'm not going to tell you it's easy, or that it isn't challenging; what I will say is that the opportunities are there to not only help the children and young people attain their goals but, at the same time, develop your own fresh aims and targets in life, which are rarely easy or unchallenging.


