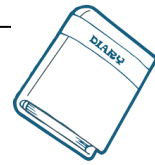

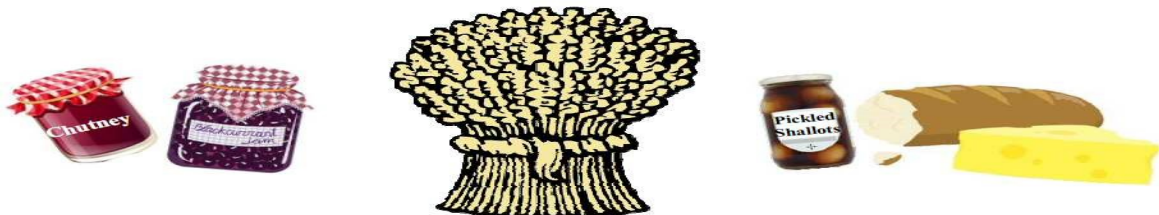

## REPORT FROM COUNCILLOR SUE HOPE, COTSWOLD EDGE WARD

### Planning and decision making – Confused?

The world of planning has been made more complicated by changes to the Planning Committee System; that is those councillors who sit on committees and make planning decisions.

There will be no more Development Control committees which were divided geographically (East & West); and no more public involvement at Sites Meetings. The emphasis in the future will be on the strategic planning growth, with an overarching Committee meeting twice a year; a strategic major sites committee and a development control committee covering the rest.

These changes are against a background of concern over Planning Policy, as there are

delays in this process, with doubts being cast over the soundness of the Joint Strategic Plan, and no timeline given for the production of the Local Plan.

The Council has decided to challenge some Planning Inspector's decisions at strategic sites at Charfield and Thornbury.

No wonder we are all confused and feel bamboozled by the planners.

The recently published Section 106 for the Park Street Development gives details on the seven affordable houses to be included in the scheme; these will not be for local people, unless we can work with the housing association to secure this.

There has also been a reduction in the Committees at the Cotswolds Conservation Board – a public body using public money to look

after the AONB. The three committees have been disbanded with the setting up of Task and Finish Groups – however there is no paper trail for them it would appear and no information online.

The move towards a National Park seems to be being considered, but the decision for this will be made at national level. The Board have recently produced a Management Plan, which should be available online.

MAF grants – if you are looking for a small grant please get in touch with me to discuss in the first instance. and don't forget to get in touch for any help I can give.

## **Hawkesbury Upton's "Community Land Trust (CLT)"**



### **AFFORDABLE HOMES FOR LOCAL PEOPLE**

A quick update, following our article in August which outlined the overall value and principles of a CLT for Hawkesbury Upton.

Following a successful application for start-up funding and support from the National CLT Network, our informal Steering Group met on the 11th September with Ian Crawley (a local CLT consultant, funded by of the National CLT Network) to kick off this initiative.

The principle objectives were (a) for Ian to review Hawkesbury Upton's community activities over recent years to enable him to recommend to the National CLT Network whether they should continue to support and help fund the development of the CLT, and (2) for our informal Steering Group to better understand its immediate priorities.

As a result of this meeting the informal Steering Group will be focussing on making sure everyone in our community is aware of what we want to achieve with the CLT. CLTs are democratic, controlled by local people for the benefit of the whole community, so everyone must have the opportunity to have their say and become involved in any way they wish.

Another outcome which emerged from the meeting was surprising, and demonstrates the potential value of a CLT. The Park Street development (which has recently been approved - for 21 houses, including 7 affordable homes) was justified on the back of Hawkesbury Parish's Affordable Housing Needs Survey, which identified a local need for 10 affordable homes. However, despite the whole development being justified on this local need, it transpires that local people will not necessarily have priority over the Park Street affordable homes which will simply be allocated to those in South Gloucestershire with the greatest need. Hence, despite the Park Street development delivering 7 affordable homes, Hawkesbury Upton still requires an additional 10 affordable homes to meet its local need.

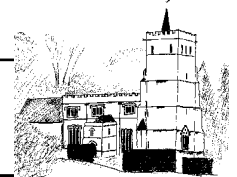

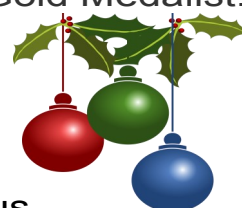

### Inglestone & Hawkesbury Commons - Seed Enhancement

Soon you will see the commencement of our seed enhancement works on Inglestone and Hawkesbury Commons.

The seed enhancement works are part of the Higher Level Stewardship agreement with Natural England and will hopefully improve the site in the long term for wildlife by creating more species rich areas of grassland.

This enhancement work can look quite drastic but the process is necessary to give the wildflower seed the best chance of establishing in a dense grass sward. The process involves removing as much vegetative growth as possible, creating bare soil patches, ideally up to 50% bare soil across the whole of the improvement site. Specially selected wildflower seed is then sown directly onto the soil and rolled to help improve seed/soil contact.

These sites may need some weed control during their first growing season and will need successive cut & collects each year around July to August, with possible topping up of seed until we have an established wildflower meadow.

One species that we hope will improve the efforts of our wildflower meadows in establishing is Yellow Rattle (*Rhinanthus minor*). Yellow rattle is an attractive, semi-parasitic, grassland annual. If it successfully establishes itself, it will take some of the nutrients from the roots of neighbouring grasses, reducing grass growth by up to 50%. Helping to reduce the vigour of grasses, it gives the slower growing wildflowers a chance to establish, flower and seed.

## Hawkesbury Hedgehog Watch

Hibernation begins for most hedgehogs in October or November. They can be seen wandering about, however right up until Christmas or even after, especially if the hog has not managed to collect enough food to see itself through the winter. They can also be upset by a warmer spell of weather and will wake up and perhaps go for a forage for food.

With the climate changes and our warmer winters, many hedgehogs are not going into hibernation until well into January when the frosts & cold weather is at its worst.

- Hedgehogs do not hibernate continuously
- They get up for a few days at a time all throughout the winter
- They are desperately looking for food to top themselves up before going back into hibernation as the weather gets colder again.
- Put food and water down all the time. This food will be a life saver.

A hedgehog needs to weigh at least 600 grams in order for it to survive hibernation

If you find a hedgehog weighing less than this in the period between late September and early March, then it needs help.



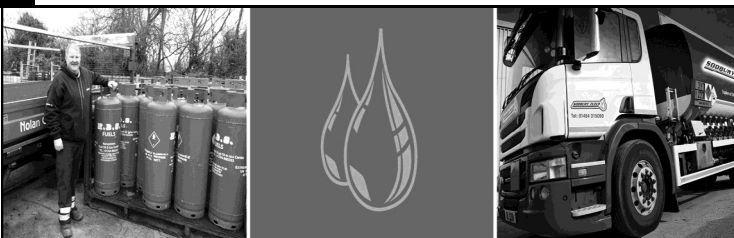

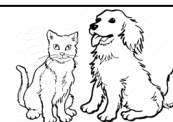
